### **Choosing Appropriate Club Activities**

To assist members in deciding on the appropriateness of a particular activity the guide below will be introduced to assist you in determining accessibility and the fitness level required. This will be based on the relevant information provide by the Venues.

EASY - This activity would be suitable for most members including those with mobility issues and some fitness concerns. Depending on the mobility/fitness level a carer might also be required to attend. There should be limited walking involved over mostly level surfaces. Any stairs would have a handrail and there should be alternatives to stairs available such as lifts or ramps.

MODERATE - This activity would be suitable to members with reasonable fitness levels. There would be some walking involved. Walking might be over uneven surfaces. Stairs might be involved and alternative options to stairs unavailable.

**DEMANDING** - This activity would be suitable to members with good fitness levels. There would be considerable walking involved and can involve stairs, uneven ground and elevations.
